

Sherwood Forest Projects & Service Work

Under the auspices of Sherwood Forest Naturalist Program, campers are offered the opportunity to make a difference, to be the good steward, to become a meaningful player in the conservation and restoration of the Severn River & Chesapeake Bay. In collaboration with colleges, universities, county, state, and federal agencies, campers:

- build and plant tidal and non-tidal wetlands
- conduct baygrass reforestation operations
- manage Sherwood's baygrass nursery
- redeem Maryland diamondback terrapins
- headstart Maryland diamondback terrapins
- rebuild the bird choir of Sherwood Forest
- set (breed) millions of oysters seasonally
- seed numerous oyster reefs throughout the Severn River
- conduct baygrass surveys for the US Fish & Wildlife Service
- construct sensitive habitats
- research the history of Sherwood Forest
